This is a fac-simile of the RED CROSS WEEK slides which are being displayed free of charge by all motion picture theaters in Minnesota to give prominence to the campaign for two million dollars (\$2,000,000) as Minnesota's part of the "Hundred Million Dollar Special War Fund," to be subscribed in the United States during the week June 18 to 25. The state campaign is being managed from headquarters in Minneapolis with Governor J. A. A. Burnquist as chairman. Reports from headquarters indicate that Minnesota will greatly over-subscribe its quota. It is the only separate organized city for the national campaign.
