Fleas Travel on Fleas.

A new "flea's flea" with an adventurous life history was described for the first time at a recent meeting of the Royal Microscopical society in London. The discoverer, F. Martin Duncan, F. R. M. S., explained that it started life in the underground nest of the humble bee. RESOLUTION NO. 200
A resolution levying a tax upon all taxable property within the city of Bemidji, Minnesota, in the year 1921 for the support of the various departments of the City government for the year 1922.

At a regular meeting of the City Council of the City of Bemidji held in the Council Chambers on Monday, October 3rd, 1921, at 8 o'clock P. M., Alderman Palmer introduced the following resolution and moved its adoption:

Resolved, That there be and is hereby levied for the support of the various departments of the City government, upon all the property taxable therefore in the City of Bemidji, Beltrami County, State of Minnesota, for each of the funds below specified, a tax in the amount equal to the annual estimate of expenditures for each of said funds, as is hereinafter recited and set forth, from which estimates there has been deducted from such funds the amount assigned to each fund, if any, from the estimated miscellaneous receipts of the City, and also any unexpended balances remaining in the treasury to the credit of such fund, if any, as follows:

For the General Fund	\$326,000.00
Library	2200.00
Perm. Imp.	7500.00
Interest	5700.00
Total Levy	\$338,800.00

Be It Further Resolved, That the tax levy herein before recited be and the same is hereby levied upon all the taxable property within the assessment district of the City of Bemidji.

That the City Clerk is directed to certify a copy of the foregoing resolution to the County Auditor of the County of Beltrami immediately after the passage, approval and publication, as the law requires.

The adoption of the resolution being duly seconded by Alderman Boyce, it was put upon its passage, and upon the call of the "Ayes" and "Nays," was declared duly passed and carried by the following vote:

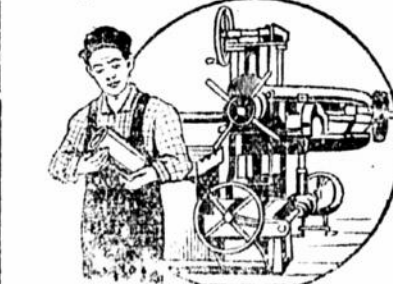
