A MILITARY POST AT ALBUQUERQUE.

In commenting upon the announcement made in The Journal a few days ago, that an army officer appointed to select a site for a Government Arsenal in the Southwest had decided upon Albuquerque, the Demo-rat says:

The location of a Government Arsenal at Albuquerque, the probability, almost certainty of which is announced in The Journal this morning, means a good deal more than appears on the surface. Government arsenals are located after a good deal of careful investigation, and with a view to a good many years of future convenience and utility.

The announcement of the location of the establishment referred to, at Albuquerque, has naturally enough been the subject of a good deal of comment, and quite a number of persons, who thought the news "too good to be true," have taken the trouble to come to the office and make inquiries as to our authority for the statement.

There are no doubts as to the credibility of the announcement. The information comes to us in a letter from O. E. Cromwell, Esq., of this city, who is now in the east, who obtained it direct from Lieut. Russell, the officer who has the matter in charge.

Russell stated to Mr. Cromwell, that after carefully examining the claims of all the available points in the southwest, he was satisfied that Albuquerque offered advantages for the location of such a depot far superior to those offered by any other point, and for this reason he had recommended, in his report, which was already made out, that the arsenal be located at Albuquerque.

That this city offers the best location in the southwest for such an establishment is beyond question. The Democrat truthfully remarks upon this point:

Located in Albuquerque, in the great mountain valley of the west, in the midst of the most extensive and productive agricultural region of the rocky mountains area, with railroad communication assured in every important direction, the advantages it presents for such a depot are far beyond those of all other points.

The advantages are not all on the side of the government: The location of such an establishment at this point will be of great advantage to Albuquerque—not only in the benefit that will be derived from it in a business way, but in the good that it will do in convincing the public of the fact that this place is destined to be the metropolis and commercial center of the southwest.

And there is an ultimate benefit to spring from it, far more important than anything that appears on the immediate surface: The locating of the arsenal at this place, means the establishment here of the military headquarters of the district, and the location of one of the permanent posts, at which all the troops of the United States army are hereafter to be maintained, in accordance with the recommendation of Gen. Sherman. A post of this character referred to, located in this section of the country, would probably have a permanent garrison of 3,000, and perhaps 5,000 men, for the superior facilities of communication by rail, offered by Albuquerque, would enable a commander here to dispatch troops, whenever their services might be needed, over a very large district of country.

None of the permanent posts referred to have yet been located, but Gen. Sherman has decided upon such a system as the future military policy, and when the time comes for selecting the locations there is hardly room for a doubt that Albuquerque will be one of them. This was considered a well-settled fact before, and the location of the arsenal here makes it doubly sure.

A VARIETY OF TALENT. One of the ablest articles on the late election that we have seen anywhere, appeared in the New Mexican two days after the fight, under the heading "The Election Result.—The Revolt against Bossism." And then a few days after, an article in the same paper, on the same subject, without any caption, but beginning, "The feather-headed Republicans," was a perfect jumble of the silliest, dullest, and most incoherent nonsense that could be produced outside of an asylum for the feeble minded. Then again, for the last two days, its leaders have been able, clear and vigorous. We do not call attention to these facts to criticize the style of our contemporary, but to congratulate it upon the possession of a broader range of talent than any other paper in this country.

THE REPUBLICAN VICTORY.

An Able and Interesting Review of the Situation. St. Paul Pioneer Press, (Rep.) The Republican party has won one of the grandest victories of modern times. It is a great thing to conquer an enemy in fair and open fight, but it is a thousand-fold greater to rise superior to self. For the first time in the political history of the United States, a great party has unflinchingly applied the knife to the cancerous sores that were sapping its vitality; has risen in its might and declared that it will neither perish or live only to serve the selfish purposes of unscrupulous men; has proved to the people its title to new confidence, by a devotion unsurpassed to pure and lofty ends. A month ago the Republican party, outwardly evil, open to reproach, and outwardly forgetful of its own great mission, was apparently hastening to its fall. Today it rises in new might to declare itself still the instrument of good government and the embodiment of the spirit of reform. It has re-voiced all cause of cavil and dejected the places which its corrupt camp-followers had befouled by long occupation. It comes now before the country with a prestige which nothing can weaken. It has a claim upon the confidence of the republic which no other organization in its history has ever been able to boast. The vote of Tuesday ensures beyond reasonable question the election of a Republican president in 1884.

It is a proper subject for congratulation that there is no possibility of mistaking the significance of these returns. When the people want to read leaders and parties a lesson, it usually happens that there is something incomplete about it; some plausible plausibility, by attributing their misfortunes to the faults or follies of others, and whenever they can thus shift their responsibility, a great part of the moral effect of the lesson is lost. This time, however, such misinterpretation is impossible. East and West, Democrats and Republicans, unite in declaring that the blow which has fallen was aimed at the machine and the sins of the machine. It was "bossism," the system which, mainly by the use of federal patronage, aims to wrest party government from the control of the people and hand it over to a little clique of unscrupulous managers, chosen independent of the people, and who, for cash, to vulgar ends, manipulate the nerves, the passions, the desires, and the fears of the masses, and promote a regular habit of body.
