

**REGULAR ARMY OFFICER**  
**PRAISES LOCAL SOLDIERS**

Secretary W. E. Holt received the following letter from one of the regular army sergeants detailed to assist the local militia company:

"My Dear Friend Mr. Holt:

"Your letter of the 27th instant enclosing the snapshot of the winning rifle team of Company 'I' was a pleasant surprise which I found awaiting me upon my arrival here this morning. I was perfectly delighted with the photograph; it will recall many pleasant memories associated with my short stay in Deming. I cannot thank you enough for it.

"I was really well pleased that Company 'I' won the rifle trophy. It was worth winning. I was very much interested in the company as a whole; they were all real nice men and intelligent men; men who took interest in their work—put their whole heart into it. That is why I took such interest in them. I always like to try to help a man who tries to do his best. But really Mr. Holt, I think that you all gave me too much credit for what I did. **GOV. McDONALD APPEALS**  
**FOR RED CROSS FUNDS**

The following communication has been received from Governor McDonald in regard to contributions to the American Red Cross Society for use in the European war:

Santa Fe, New Mexico,  
August 6, 1914  
To the people of the state of New Mexico:

The following appeal has been received from the American Red Cross for raising funds to be used in the present European war:

"During our war with Spain thousands of dollars were sent by the European Red Cross Societies to the American Red Cross to aid in the care of our sick and wounded soldiers.

"Now in the hour of their supreme need, the American Red Cross, both for the sake of humanity and to express our gratitude for their aid to us in time of trouble and distress, has decided to charter a ship and send to each involved, doctors and nurses and hospital supplies. This ship, sailing under the Red Cross flag, will be under the protection of the treaties of Geneva and the Hague and can enter any harbor for the discharge of its beneficent duty. In no other way can this trained personnel, so greatly needed, reach the different countries.

"Protection is also provided for the personnel of the Red Cross societies of neutral states that render aid, by the treaty of Geneva.

"The American Red Cross appeals most earnestly to all our people, to the Governors of States as presidents of the Red Cross state boards, to the Red Cross chapters, to the mayors of cities, to the chambers of commerce, boards of trade and to all associations and individuals, for contributions to carry on this work.

"Contributions may be designated by the donors, if they so desire, for the aid of any special country and will be used for the country designated; but assistance will be given to all in the true spirit of the Red Cross, represented by its motto: Neutrality-Humanity.

"Grieved as we may be over this terrible war, the agonizing cry of suffering men cannot appeal to us in vain.

"The American Red Cross asks for prompt and generous response. Contributions may be sent to the American Red Cross, Washington, D. C. or to state and local treasurers of the Red Cross."

I therefore urge all good citizens who are able to contribute, to do so in the name of humanity. Contributions as above stated may be sent directly to the American Red Cross at Washington, D. C. or to the treasurer of the New Mexico Red Cross State Board, Hon. O. N. Marston, at Albuquerque, New Mexico.

**Capt. Cootes to Fort Riley**

The war department has detailed Captain Harry N. Cootes, former cavalry marshal and intelligence officer of the Second cavalry brigade at El Paso and commander of Troop M, Thirteenth cavalry, as special instructor in the United States army school of equitation at Fort Riley, Kansas. He will assume his new assignment on August 15, proceeding from Columbus, N. M., where he is now stationed with his command, to Fort Riley.

Capt. Cootes completed a course in the school of equitation two years ago, having spent two years there. He also studied riding methods of the foreign armies while travelling through Europe with Secretary of War Dickinson as his aide de camp a few years ago and took a special in the Russian cavalry methods.

The detail as instructor in the riding school will make him eligible to represent the United States army in the New York City and other big horse shows which will be held during the year.
