DEMING HIGH SCHOOL WILL HOLD TRACK MEET APRIL 14

The Deming High School will hold a track meet at Deming on April 14, and it is expected that a large representation from the different schools of the county will be on hand to make things interesting for the local boys. The following letter is being sent out to all the schools in Luna county.

Deming, N. M. Mar. 27, 1916.
Dear Sir:
The Deming High School will hold its second annual inter-grade school track meet at Deming on April 14, at 1 p. m.

The meet will be divided, as it was last year, into three classes: 10 yrs. and under; 14 yrs. and under; and over 14 yrs., and will consist of the following events:

For 10 yrs., and under: 50, 100, and 220 yard runs, high jump, hop-step-and-jump, and broad jump.

For 14 years, and under, 100, 220 and 440 yard runs, shot put, high jump, broad jump, hop-step-and-jump, and 120 yard low hurdles.

For over 14 yrs. 100, 220, 440, 880 and 1-mile runs, shot put, high hurdles, hop-step-and-jump, broad jump, and pole vault.

It will be noticed that we have eliminated a number of the events which proved uninteresting to the spectators and also some which were too hard for the small boys.

Last year's events was won by Deming, who, of course, had the larg-

est number to pick from. Tunis was second and all of the other schools represented won some of the ribbons. As it was last year, the school scoring the largest number of points will be given a silver cup, while the three leading men in each event will be given ribbons.

Last year we offered entertainment to the different teams, but owing to the fact that the teams did not let us know before hand we were unable to do ourselves justice and consequently the entertainment was not entirely satisfactory.

This year, in order to handle this matter better, we desire that each school write Mr. J. B. Taylor, Supt. of City Schools, Deming, N. M., at least 5 days before the meet and let him know how many men you are sending, what events each expects to enter, and when they will arrive.

The outlook for a bigger and better meet this year is very bright, as a number of schools in Luna county who did not compete last year, have assured us of their entry this year.

Kindly let us know as soon as possible what the prospects are of your school being represented.
