REFUSES TO BE BLUFFED BY THE POWERS.

CONTINUES HER OPERATIONS.

GEORGE MAY TAKE COMMAND IN PERSON.

Continues her operations. The government-to-night sent instructions to the four towns which the powers occupied were not held in behalf of Turkey.

Colonel Yassov, the commander-in-chief of the Greek army of occupation in Crete, in the name of King George, is establishing there a system of administration. The municipal elections are already proceeding and mayors have been installed in the towns of Gortyna, Iraklio, Rethimo and Sfakia.

Paris, Feb. 18.—A dispatch received here from Athens says that King George is to take command in person of the Northern army, adding that he is reported to have preferred to die in battle than to be an exiled king, which, according to the dispatch, would be his fate in the event that he did not take the lead in the present crisis.

London, Feb. 18.—The British and Italian torpedo boats stopped the Greek ironclad, Hydra, which was conveying provisions to the Greek camp.

Rome, Feb. 18.—The Italian general staff, according to reports from the Associated Press, has asked for an opinion concerning the Greek proposal to enter Macedonia if Greece, again wired the British ambassador.

DRUNKEN INDIANS SUSPECTED.

YESTERDAY'S RECORD OF CRIME AT ANACONDA, MONT.

Two Men Arrested for the Joel Mack Murder—Six "Satchel Workers" Captured—Death Warrants for the Murderers of Pearl Bryan.

Winona, N. D., Feb. 18.—A sextuple tragedy was discovered one mile from this place to-day on the ranch of Rev. Thomas Spicer. The horribly mutilated bodies of Mr. and Mrs. Spicer, their daughter, Mrs. William Rouse, with her 1-year-old twin boys, and the aged Mrs. Waldron, the mother of the boys, were discovered scattered about the ranch, and there is yet no positive clue to the perpetrators of the horrible crime.

The appearance about the ranch, the condition of the bodies and some other circumstances have led to the suspicion that the murder was committed by Indians, and this suspicion was in part started from the known fact that one Indian was seen in the neighborhood of the ranch yesterday.

The Standing Rock Indian reservation is not far away, and when the Indians from there get away from sight and manage to get hold of whisky, there is sure to be trouble.

If the murders were committed by Indians, the murderers are undoubtedly now back among the reservation Indians. There is much excitement here over the tragedy.

HOW FARES GOMEZ?

OFFICIAL ADVICES SAY WEYLER IS PRESSING HIM HARD.

PRIVATE ADVICES DISPUTE IT.

CREDIT THE GENERAL WITH A BRILLIANT VICTORY.

Say He Has Crossed the Trocha and Is Now Between Weyler and Havana—Havana People Becoming Desperate—Hope for the End.

Havana, Feb. 18.—If the official reports are correct, the insurgent army under General Gomez has been divided into small corps, and the city is in full retreat before the continued advance of Weyler.

Dispatches from Ciego de Avila, say that the insurgent commander-in-chief, with 4,000 men, has recrossed the military line in the province of Pinar del Rio, and is going eastward through Puerto Principe and in the direction of the capital of the province.

General Calisto Garcia (Gomez) second in command, was reported to have crossed the line in the vicinity of Puerto Principe and retreating towards the same point as Gomez.

Weyler arrived yesterday at Sancti Spiritus, the most important town in the eastern part of the province of Santa Clara, near the boundary of Puerto Principe, and in the territory where the insurgent headquarters was recently located, and as he has been able to reach that place, the report that Gomez is retreating would appear to be borne out.

The statements from the Spanish headquarters are even more explicit. It is announced that the insurgents have retreated to the mountains and are now preparing for the Spanish advance, and that from Sancti Spiritus Weyler will push forward to Moron, Ciego de Avila and Jucaro, thus seeming to sweep across the island with a large force and driving the Spanish army toward the western part of the island.

Strategically, Weyler's position is a good one, and adapted to keep his troops supplied well. He expects to trap Gomez between the mountains and the sea, and thus force a decisive engagement before the rains put an end to military operations. The Cubans believe, however, that Gomez will, as usual, slip through the fingers of the Spanish general.

Key West, Fla., Feb. 18.—Private information has been received in this city of the whereabouts of General Gomez. He has succeeded in sliding by General Weyler, and is now in the vicinity of Sancti Spiritus. General Gomez gave the command for an advance, with strict orders that any man that struck a match would be court-martialed. He then advanced on the Moron front, and the western end of the island, 5,000 cavalry and 10,000 infantry. He advanced on the fort at midnight, and when he saw he was discovered by the Spanish, who fired on him, he ordered the cavalry to charge. They swooped down on the fort and captured it, and the Spanish army, through the social air of the arms and ammunition of the fort were captured.
