A BLIZZARD RAGING.

WEST AND NORTHWEST SWEPT BY A SEVERE STORM.

HEAVY DAMAGE IN DENVER.

ELECTRIC CARS STOPPED AND RAILROADS BLOCKED.

A Thousand Poles and 4,000 Miles of Wires Down—City in Darkness—Snow Extends Eastward Into Nebraska and Kansas.

Cripple Creek, Col., Oct. 26.—Not in years has there been such a blizzard here as that which prevails at the present time. High winds that come in gusts like waves of a typhoon are drifting the snow so that sidewalks in places are almost impassable. Traffic on railroads is suspended, and telephone wires are down. Canons are choked with snow, and it is impossible to see 100 feet on account of the blinding storm. Attempts to mine property have been stopped. Mining operations are seriously impeded by the storm which has been raging fourteen hours and continues furiously with no sign of abatement soon. The weather is very cold and the snow will be great drifts among the pines.

THE ATLANTIC HURRICANE.

Somewhat Abated, but Squalls Are Still Blowing—List of Casualties Growing.

Philadelphia, Oct. 26.—While the north-east hurricane on the Middle Atlantic coast has abated in fury to-night, sharp squalls are still blowing around the Delaware capes, and enormous tides are reported all along the bay and river. The list of mariners and fishermen who were swept away to pieces at Fourteen Foot bank, eighty miles below this city, the vessel's master, Captain J. J. O'Connell, says that a party of twelve men reached this city to-night, and that the rest of the crew were killed or drowned. The twelfth man of the crew, Marlon Castellano, refused to leave the ship, and in all probability is lost.

THREW HIS OWN LITTLE GIRL INTO THE MISSOURI.

ADMITS THE ATROCIOUS CRIME.

SHOWS NOT A TINGE OF PITY OR OF REMORSE.

IT WAS THE ACT OF A FIEND.

HIS ONLY DESIRE SEEMS TO BE TO SHIELD HIS WIFE.

As He Saw Her Body Disappear He Says His Only Thought Was That She Was Out of the Way—Talks Freely in His Stupid Way.

William Carr, laborer; ignorant, unable to read or write; tall, loose-jointed, muscular; feebly cruel in his home life, blunted in conscience, dwarfed and warped in human feeling, has confessed that he murdered his little 3-year-old daughter, Belle, by blinding a stone upon her breast and casting her, breathing and conscious, into the Missouri river. He admitted the crime to the police of this city yesterday afternoon, after having been locked up only twenty-four hours.



THE YELLOW FEVER RECORD.

Seven New Cases in Memphis, and People Are Meeting—Bad Day in New Orleans.

Memphis, Tenn., Oct. 26.—To-day's yellow fever record in this city is seven new cases and no deaths. All of the new cases with a single exception are in the southern part of the city, where the original cases were discovered. More than a thousand people have left the city within the last twenty-four hours. Dr. Thornton, president of the board of health, in an interview with the Journal, said that he does not anticipate an epidemic. In fact, he can see no cause for serious alarm. A cold wave is expected to sweep over the city in the next few days, and the health officer believes that the disease has reached its worst stage so far as Memphis is concerned.

Leave Dawson City for the States Because of Scarcity of Provisions.

Aberdeen, Wash., Oct. 26.—The schooner Society has arrived from St. Michael's with twenty-three returning miners, nine of whom have been on the Yukon several years. They all tell about scarcity of provisions at Circle City and Dawson, and give their reasons for leaving for the States. They say they were nearly all dead when they were taken back to the States, but were very silent as to amounts.
