LONDON, Aug. 21.—The Anglo-Egyptian

reconquest of the Sudan is steadily

approaching a culmination.

Khartoum will be captured in a few days.

British policy in the Sudan. If the French

think about the matter at all they assume

that Kitchener will clear out of the Sudan

as soon as the dervishes are finally

defeated.

and to use it as a base for operations

against the possibility of a war with
