

PATRICK SODEN, DEAD

WAS AN OLD AND WELL KNOWN RESIDENT OF KANSAS CITY.

Succumbed to Heart Failure—Had Amassed a Comfortable Fortune in Railroad Contracting—Left Valuable Property.

Patrick Soden, an old and well known citizen of Kansas City, whose critical illness was announced in The Journal yesterday, died at 10:45 o'clock yesterday morning, at his home, 121 Central street.

Mr. Soden had been suffering from trouble since last March, and it is only a few weeks ago he returned from Hot Springs, Ark., where he was being treated.

He had been very low for several days and when the end came yesterday all of his family were about him with the exception of his son, Charles, who belongs to the Twentieth United States infantry, now in Manila.

The funeral will take place Monday morning at 9:30 o'clock from the Cathedral. Mr. Soden leaves a widow and the following children: Dr. F. J. Soden, of the Wheaton, Kas.; Charles A. Soden, of the Twentieth Infantry at Manila; Mrs. J. E. Bourke, wife of Chief Clerk Bourke, of the Pittsburg & Gulf, who lives at 118 Prospect avenue, and Harry and Ralph Soden. His son George Soden died about a year ago. His two brothers, Peter and Michael Soden, the latter living at Muncie, Ind.

Sketch of His Life.

Mr. Soden was born in County Cavan, Ireland, in 1835. In 1854 he came to America and settled at Liberty, Mo. Three years later he came to Kansas City and entered the business of railroad building with his elder brother, Peter Soden, who lives at 149 Central street. In 1867 they built the branch of the Pacific railroad from Jackson, Mo., through Jackson county, other roads which they helped to build were the Memphis from here to Belton, Mo., and the Cameron road to Harlan.

Mr. Soden owned much valuable property and real estate in Kansas City. Among other property belonging to the estate are three houses on Missouri avenue, the building on the northeast corner of Eighth and Main streets, the building at 302 Grand avenue, besides the home and other small dwellings. Of late Mr. Soden had been in the real estate business.

Death of Dr. C. C. Bingham.

On June 1 Dr. Calvin C. Bingham, of this city, died at the home of his daughter, Mrs. A. J. Kirkland, 20 Lafayette avenue, Brooklyn, N. Y. Dr. Bingham was a well known physician in Kansas City, having come here from Brooklyn ten years ago. He resided at 132 Troost avenue up to the time he went East for his health about three months ago.

FRANK STEWART ARRESTED.

Charged With Sending His Wife Away to Live in Goddard Case.

A warrant was issued by Prosecutor Reed yesterday for the arrest of Frank R. Stewart, cashier at the postoffice, claiming that he sent his wife out of the city to prevent her from testifying in the Dr. J. D. Goddard trial.

"This is a grand stand play by the prosecutor," said Mr. Stewart yesterday. "I don't want my wife mixed up in any such case. She was not called by the state before and the defense has her deposition. Suppose I did tell her to go, why had I not done so before?"

Mr. Stewart was arrested last night and arraigned before Justice Spitz. He gave bond for his appearance this week.
