Folk on the Issues in Missouri.
The Washington Post of November 20 prints the following interview with Governor-elect Joseph W. Folk:

"I am certainly not a believer in trying to recognize the Democratic party on old lines. The independent vote in both parties is now large, and is gaining every day. They are the elements which must now be catered to," said Mr. Folk. He was asked if he would be a candidate for president four years hence. He said: "That is a long ways ahead, and I might not be on the map then physically or politically. Just now I am trying to keep my fences in proper shape in Missouri. I can assure you that it keeps me busy enough to interview all that desire to see me on important political business which mainly concern themselves. Just at present Missouri is about as big a field as I care to cover."

"What are you going to do about the hoodlums still remaining at large in Missouri?" was another question put to Mr. Folk, and he said:

"The cases of a great many of them are to be brought to trial, and although as governor I will not be able to directly take part in the court proceedings, yet under the present state laws I can send the attorney general to any county to push the prosecution of criminals, so that if county officials should prove remiss in their duties I can still find a way to reach the rascals. The party in power in Missouri for over a generation had so entrenched itself that some of the machine leaders thought they never could be removed and their rascality discovered," and further he says: "The recent upheaval for honest government, and its very suggestive results, whereby every democrat on the state ticket was defeated except myself, who made the fight solely upon the issues of honest government, home rule, and the prosecution of all hoodlums, shows that there are enough independent voters at all times in Missouri who will support what they believe to be right to carry the state elections."

"When asked what would be his main issue touched upon in his first message to the legislature, Mr. Folk said:

"I have not yet fully made up my mind as to what issue will first be

used upon the legislature. Probably I will ask for a primary election law for the state, for measures to improve the roads of Missouri, and I may urge the repeal of the laws which empower the governor to appoint the police boards of the large cities of the state, on the ground that each city should look after its own local self-government. There is a great deal of opposition to the repeal of these laws, as the people seem to fear that the police will get into the hands of grafters unless the police boards are kept out of municipal politics. I am carefully looking into the matter from all sides and have not yet fully made up my mind as to what is best to do regarding the home rule proposition."

Fire at Waverly.

The frame building belonging to N. J. Gordon, on the corner of Main and Washington streets, burned to the ground last Friday night. The building was occupied by M. Marinsky with a small stock of merchandise, valued by Mr. Marinsky at about \$1200. This stock was entirely consumed.

The fire started about 1 o'clock Saturday morning from the explosion of a coal oil lamp. The force of the explosion threw oil over the room and gave the fire a start that carried it beyond control before help could arrive.

Mr. Gordon held a policy for \$250 insurance on the building and this claim has been allowed. Mr. Marinsky, we understand, held a policy for \$800, but the adjustment of this claim is not yet announced. Mr. Gordon had stored in his building a set of butcher's tools, on which the insurance had expired a few days before the fire. These, of course, were a total loss.

Cloth Made Fireproof.

United States Consul Frank W. Mabin sends from Nottingham, England, the following information relative to a new cloth fireproofing material:

"In a paper read at a meeting of a society of dyers in Manchester, titanic acid (the oxide of titanium) was claimed to possess remarkable fireproofing properties, and evidence was produced in the shape of experiments by the reader of the paper. He took, for instance, some pieces of flannel which had been treated with titanic acid, and put a match to them.

"The incipient fire in the material smoldered and went out, refusing to burst into a flame. The experimenter claimed that all inflammable textiles could thus be rendered fireproof, and that dyeing, boiling, or washing would not remove the acid, it becoming, in fact, an integral part of the fabric."

Gas at Buckner.

Jackson County Judge.
Gas was struck at Buckner Monday by the drillers who are seeking oil in that neighborhood. It is estimated that the flow will be at least 15,000 cubic feet a day and while of little or no commercial value, it is deemed by those interested as a good sign. The gas was struck at a depth of 285 feet and the drillers will go on in their search for oil.

Those in charge of the rig say the indications for oil there are good. They declare the further down they go the better oil formations are found and expect before long to strike a deep flow. Oil in small quantity was recently struck at Lake City where the surface indications are not deemed as promising as at Buckner.

Railroad Coal Consumption.

The total coal production of the United States is now at the rate of 1,000,000 tons per day, and the consumption of coal by railroads is equal to 40 per cent of this, or 400,000 tons per day. In Geo. R. Henderson's paper, read at the December meeting of the American Society of Mechanical Engineers, he stated that the fuel bill of a railroad contributes about 10 per cent of the total expense of the operation and 30 to 40 per cent of the total cost of running the locomotive. A locomotive will consume on an average \$5,000 worth of coal per annum, and for a road having an equipment of 1,000 locomotives the coal bill is approximately \$5,000,000.
