### The Origin of Corn.

Harsberger in his book entitled "Maize, a Botanical Study," says "The evidence of archaeology, history, ethnology, and philology which points to Central and Southern Mexico as the original home of maize is supported by botany and meteorology." Corn was found by the first Europeans who came to America, and its cultivation was reported from all parts of America, at least as far south as Chili. It was not known in any other country before the discovery of America. There it had been long cultivated and highly prized, as evidenced by the fact that ears of corn are occasionally found in vessels placed in Indian mounds in Chili and Central America. The Mexicans had a goddess of maize, who was known, according to the authorities, as "abe who sustains us." In a temple in Mexico containing seventy-eight chapels, the forty-fifth edifice contained a statue of the "God of Maize." Corn, charred by volcanic heat, is a common find among the ancient cliff-dwellings of Arizona.

### Variety Tests of Wheat.

[Weekly Agriculture Letter.]

The results of the wheat variety tests for 1905 at the Missouri Experiment Station have just been tabulated. About fifty varieties were tested in plots being sown to Fultz wheat which was used as a standard of comparison, thus eliminating any error due to soil differences. Each variety was compared with the average of the two Fultz plots on either side and the result expressed in per cent.

The wheat giving the highest relative yield was an important variety known as the Karkov a smooth, red-berried wheat, rather fine of straw and late in maturing. The wheat is of good quality and it will be interesting to note the effect of further tests on this variety. The Falcastrer came next, yielding 21.9 more than the Fultz under similar conditions. This is a smooth red wheat with stiff straw which is familiar to many Missouri farmers. Dawson's Golden Chaff, a

smooth white wheat of medium maturity, gave the third highest relative yield, while Ghirka, an important Russian wheat, closely resembling the Turkey Red, a bearded wheat with red grain was fourth in the list. It is interesting to note that the imported wheats this year the season seeming to be especially favorable to their development.

Common Turkey Red gave a yield of 35.6 bushels per acre, the highest yielding variety, although it was sixth in relative yield, due to soil conditions. Poole wheat, an Ohio variety, with smooth heads, red grain and medium straw also yielded well. This variety promises much on this soil type. Other varieties showing good yields were the Hickman, Beechwood Hybrid, Rochester Red, Nixon, Deits, Mealy and Lebanon. All of these except the Lebanon are smooth wheats, the Mealy having a velvet chaff. The undesirability of growing Club wheats in this climate was demonstrated by the facts that these short compact heads allow the grain to dry out slowly and cause it to sprout badly in wet weather.

The Experiment Station has had many calls for seed wheat but as they have only a limited supply it has been necessary to refuse most of these. There are so few men who grow wheat for seed in any quantity in this state that it is very difficult to suggest the proper sources of supply. Farmers will usually find it best to buy through their local grain or elevator men, if possible, as these men are more interested in the wheat of the community than dealers at a distance.

They are very favorably impressed with the mining prospects of that country and are of the opinion that there are some good opportunities to be had there.

In some parts of Oregon products of a tropical character can be raised, although Oregon is about as far north as Minnesota. At the Lewis and Clark Fair Douglas county shows two small stalks of bamboo which were raised in that county, and some first-class figs and tobacco. The country raises much grain also, as is attested by an exhibit of rye in the straw ten feet tall. The fruit industry is profitably carried on there.

## What Japan Demanded and What Treaty Contains.

Japan's twelve conditions of peace have been disposed of by the Peace Conference as follows:

Article I—Russia's recognition of Japan's preponderating influence in Korea. Agreed upon.

Article II—Mutual obligations to evacuate Manchuria. Agreed upon.

Article III—Japanese obligations to restore Manchuria to China. Agreed upon.

Article IV—Mutual obligations to respect territorial integrity of China and establish open door to world. Agreed upon.

Article V—Cession of Sakhalin Island to Japan. Compromised by agreement that Russia is to cede southern half of island to Japan and retain northern half; neither nation to fortify and each to grant the most-favored-nation privileges to the other on the island.

Article VI—Cession to Japan of leases of Liaotung Peninsula. Agreed upon.

Article VII—Cession of Chinese Eastern Railroad from Harbin south, to Japan. Compromised by agreement that Russia will cede to Japan that part of the railroad running south from Quanchostze, near Chantufu, which is now held by Oyama's army.

Article VIII—Retention by Russia of that part of railroad connecting Harbin and the Transiberian road with Vladivostok. Agreed upon.

Article IX—Reimbursement of Japan for cost of war. Withdrawn by Japan.

Article X—Surrender of interned Russian warships. Withdrawn by Japan.

Article XI—Limitation of Russia's future naval activity in the far East. Withdrawn by Japan.

Article XII—Grant of fishing rights to Japan on Siberian coast. Granted with modifications.
