**IDLENESS LEADS TO CRIME**

Statements of English Boys Convicted of Petty Offenses Prove Truth of Saying.

The official report on the prison population in England remarks on the fact that many of the young boys convicted of crime were unemployed at the time the offense was committed and had been unemployed except at rare intervals since leaving school. In one of the London prisons it was found that many of the boys received, boys between the ages of 16 and 20, had hardly been to school at all and could neither read nor write. They generally explain their illiteracy by saying that they come from neighborhoods where attendance officers can be evaded or defied. These "juvenile-adults," as prisoners between 16 and 20 years of age are called, are, in stature and weight, under the average of the rural laboring class, and even under that of the artisan population of the towns.
