AFTER YOUNG SMOKERS

Ministers of Lexington Urge Mayor to Enforce Law.

The Ministers' alliance of Lexington has unanimously adopted the following resolutions, which explain themselves:

Whereas, the smoking of cigarettes by the boys and young men of Lexington has become exceedingly prevalent, and

Whereas, we believe such practice to be highly injurious to the physical, mental and moral welfare of the youth of our community, who indulge in it, and

Whereas, no profit can come to any of our citizens from the sale of cigarettes except to such as are engaged in the traffic, and

Whereas, there is in existence in this city an ordinance forbidding the sale or giving away of cigarettes, or cigarette wrappers, to minors, under penalty of a fine of not less than one dollar nor more than two hundred dollars, therefore

Be it resolved, by the Ministers' Alliance of Lexington that we respectfully request the Honorable Thomas J. Walton, Mayor of Lexington, to use the power vested in him as the Chief Executive of the city to secure the enforcement of this ordinance.

Be it resolved, further, that a copy of these resolutions be presented to the Mayor and a copy each to the Lexington Intelligencer, the Daily Advertiser and the Lexington News for publication.
