Fruit Crop Report.

Reports on the condition of the fruit crop August 1st, 1910, show a slight improvement over the outlook May 15th. The apple crop is largely confined to the three tiers of counties along the western border of the state from Iowa to Arkansas. From these counties correspondents report almost one-half (48.4 per cent) of a full crop. Insects and diseases have not been bad and in almost every case have easily been held in check by spraying. The quality of apples this year will be decidedly above the average. Many orchards are yielding almost entirely a fancy grade. Several correspondents in the northwestern part of the state claim that apples are being injured by the continued dry weather.

Peaches were ripening at the time the reports were sent in. The peach crop this year for the most part, is located in the counties where there are apples but in addition some of the south central counties, particularly Oregon and the southeastern part of Iowa, have a full crop where there are few or no apples. The average of the counties where there are any peaches at all is reported as 47 per cent of a full crop, which is a pronounced improvement over the outlook May 15th.

Peaches have rotted where they were not sprayed. The sprayed orchards have a fine quality of peaches almost free from curculio stings and rot. The past season has been a wholesome object lesson of the value of spraying peach trees with arsenate of lead paste and un-boiled lime-sulphur, the one controlling the curculio, the insect which stings the fruit, and the other the brown rot. Prices for peaches being sold are very good.

Grapes were badly frozen out in April, but the new buds which came out afterward are producing on an average from one-fourth to one-third of a full crop.


