Students From University of Missouri Win Contest And Break All Previous Records.
On Nov. 26, 1910, the Live Stock Judging Team from the University of Missouri won the International Live Stock Judging Contest and broke all previous records for individual score and total team score, making a total score of 250 points more than the team ranking second.

The winning of this contest brings to the University of Missouri a beautiful trophy valued at \$500.00. With the awarding of the highest individual honors to W. R. Heckler of Missouri, the University is awarded a beautiful loving cup valued at \$150.00.

A remarkable feature of this contest is the fact that the three highest individual scores in the contest were made by Missouri students and a fourth man, tied for fourth highest score, while the fifth Missouri student ranked eighth.

In other words, every member of the Missouri team was in the honored list of the ten highest men and each made a score higher than the best record of any previous year.

The Missouri team was:
First in Grand Total—5379.
First in Horse Judging—1280.
First in Cattle Judging—1418.
First in Swine Judging—1384.
Second in Sheep Judging—1297.

The winning of the above entitles the Missouri Agriculture College to four J. Ogden Armour Scholarships which amount to \$250.00 each and are to be awarded to needy students in the College of Agriculture.

This is conceded to be the most remarkable victory ever won in a stock judging contest by any institute.

On Nov. 22, the same Live Stock Judging Team from the University of Missouri won the Saddle Horse Judging trophy, a beautiful silver loving cup, valued at \$100.00 and offered by the American Saddle Breeders Association. The three highest individual scores in this contest, were made by Missouri students, a fourth Missouri man being tied for fourth place.

Last Call for the Short Winter Course.
The next term of the Short Winter Course in Agriculture begins at Columbia January 3, 1911. The first term which began November first is just closing to a close with the largest enrollment in the history of the University of Missouri. 176 men have been studying agriculture for two months, in the laboratories, demonstration rooms, lecture halls, barns, stables and fields of the Missouri College of Agriculture. This is a 500 per cent increase over the enrollment in the same term last year.

It should be understood that the courses in the second term are complete in themselves and not dependent upon the courses given during the first term. Any young man will find no difficulty in entering January 3, 1911. There are no entrance requirements. The work is practical and given with the idea of immediate application to farm conditions. Five additional instructors have been employed for this work. All prospective students should present themselves for enrollment promptly on the first day of the term.
