Lecturer on Live Stock.
The Missouri State Board of Agriculture has secured the services of Mr. J. K. Wright as farmers' institute lecturer on animal husbandry.

Mr. Wright was born and reared on a Missouri farm and graduated a few years ago from the College of Agriculture at Columbia. He is a thorough student of agricultural conditions, an interesting speaker, and capable of judging either grain or live stock. As superintendent of schools in Boone county he organized the boys of the country schools into corn growers' clubs, and interested the girls in cooking and sewing competitions, an annual fair where the boys and girls entered their work being a feature.

For more than a year the Missouri Board has been looking for an all-round live stock man. After considering a number of men, including several from other states, Mr. Wright was chosen. With this additional man in the field, the Board hopes to be able to meet most of the demands for farmers' institute work.

School for Institute Workers.
At the suggestion of T. C. Wilson, secretary of the Missouri State Board of Agriculture, a "School of instruction" for all the institute workers and lecturers under the Board will be held at Columbia during the latter part of July or first of August. It is believed that this meeting, to be held at the College of Agriculture, will result in making the work of the Board's representatives of still more practical value to the people.

Farmers' Week Date.
The date for the annual "Farmers' Week," at Columbia has been fixed for the second week in January, it being the sense of the Missouri State Board of Agriculture that this date should be made permanent.
