**New Transatlantic Service.**  
Philadelphia, Pa., March 30.—The departure of the steamship Northwestern Miller from this port today marks the inauguration of a new fast freight service between Philadelphia and London, to be operated by the Philadelphia Transatlantic Line. The Northwestern Miller is to be followed by the steamships Southwestern Miller and the Dominion Miller, which are her sister ships. All of the vessels will make the passage between Philadelphia and London in ten days. In the past all of the regular line boats between these two ports have consumed between 15 and 17 days in making the trip.

**Girls Sue "Possum Hunters."**  
Rockport, Ky., March 30.—A special term of the Butler circuit court convened today for the trial of a group of alleged "possum hunters," whose outrages have caused a reign of terror in this section of Kentucky for more than six months. The charges against the accused men are of a most sensational character and owing to the high state of public feeling additional deputies are to be stationed at the courthouse while the trials are in progress.

The principal witnesses at the trials will be Louella and Katherine Websters, members of a well-known Kentucky family who allege they were attacked in their homes by the "possum hunters," blindfolded, dragged into the cold and then disrobed by the regulators, who afterward applied the lash to their bare backs: After the beating, which took place at midnight, the girls declare they were taken back to their homes and shoved across the threshold where they lay unconscious until found by relatives. A total of more than thirty wealthy Butler County men have been named as defendants in the case. In addition to the criminal charges civil suits for \$10,000 damages have been filed against the men by their alleged victims.
