

**DEATH RATE HIGHER
AMONG BOTTLE BABIES**

Dr. Ravenel of U. of M. Warns Mothers Against Feeding Unclean Cow's Milk.

"Too many babies are artificially fed instead of being nursed by their mothers."

This statement was made recently by Dr. M. P. Ravenel, professor of bacteriology and preventive medicine at the University of Missouri at Columbia.

"The death rate is always greater among bottle-fed babies than in the breast-fed ones," continued Dr. Ravenel. "Cow's milk is perhaps the best substitute for mother's milk but the necessary precautions should be taken to keep it perfectly clean. Most of the dirt in milk comes from stable manure, which falls into the cans from dirty flanks and the udder during the process of milking. The cow should be curried and her belly and flanks clipped. The udder and belly should be moistened with a damp cloth just before milking and the hands of the milker should be clean.

"The second precaution which should be observed is that of cooling the milk as soon as drawn and keeping it cool.

"All vessels in which the milk is kept should be thoroughly cleaned. This is best done by rinsing with some alkaline washing powder, then clean water, finally sterilization by boiling water or steam."


