Preparation of Dried Products For Storing.

Dried products should be carefully prepared for storing to insure against destruction by insects or mold. The products may be conditioned by placing them in boxes and pouring them from one box to another occasionally during three or four days so that they will become thoroughly mixed and so that the whole mass will obtain an even degree of moisture. In case the material appears to be too moist, replace in the drier for a short time.

Insects are likely to do considerable damage to dried products unless special precaution is taken. The insects which are found in dried products usually deposit their eggs about dusk or dark. A sun dried product should be carefully covered or taken in at sundown. It is advisable to heat the product to a temperature of 140 degrees Fahrenheit long enough to allow the heat to penetrate through just before storing. This will sterilize an infested product.

Large tin cans or glass jars make good containers for dried products, but they are not necessary. Paper cartons, boxes, and sacks may be used. It is a
