**Modification of Order Relative to Conservation of Fuel and Light.**

1. All stores, places of amusement, office buildings and lodges may remain open until 10:00 p. m. every night beginning Saturday, January 26, 1918.
2. Theatres of any kind may open every day and night until 10 p. m.
3. Saloon may remain open until 10 p. m., but shall not open Monday morning between the hours of midnight and 1:00 a. m.
4. All night restaurants may remain open as usual.
5. In order that there may be no confusion in these modifications, it is the sense of these regulations that all business must stop at 10 p. m. every night, regardless of what fuel or power is used.
6. Committeemen may continue to enforce their local rulings, provided the fuel conditions warrant such action, and provided that no later closing than 10 p. m. is allowed.
7. These rulings will remain in effect until further notice.

Further instructions to members of Fuel Committees.

1. In case of violation of your orders or those of this Administration, the guilty party should be reported at once to this office. The penalty is that a supply of fuel will be cut off from any store, etc., which disobeys the rulings, or, if necessary, anyone found guilty is liable to a fine of Five Thousand Dollars, and imprisonment for two years. A warning from you should be sufficient.

2. The use of long distance telephone and telegrams should be restricted to emergency calls for coal. This service should be used sparingly, which will be understood when each one realizes that there are about 300 committeemen in this state.
