It is a practical certainty that within a few months the people will have to pay vastly increased passenger and freight rates because of wage advances allowed to railroad employees. The Railroad Labor Board has granted wage increases of approximately 20 per cent totaling more than \$500,000,000 a year. To meet this additional pay roll the railroads have asked the Interstate Commerce Commission for permission to increase passenger rates 20 per cent and freight rates 10 per cent. These increases are in addition to the 30 per cent increase in freight rates already on file for the purpose of meeting additional cost of operation. If all the increases are granted freight rates will be 40 per cent higher than at present. Such increases are certain to arouse great dissatisfaction among patrons of the railroads unless the employes show a decided improvement in efficiency.


