DRUNKENNESS, INDECENT CONDUCT AND INCOMPETENCY ALLEGED.

Rogers Is a Regent of the State University and Mr. Leland Declares the Example He Sets Is Injurious to Its Best Interests.

Topeka, Kas., March 22.—(Special.) Another sensation was sprung at the state house today when Hon. Cyrus Leland, chairman of the Republican state central committee, filed charges against Senator Rogers, of Washington county, who is a member of the board of regents for the state university. The charges were made by Senator Rogers around Topeka during the recent session of the legislature and since have become notorious and Mr. Leland will have no difficulty in sustaining the charges he makes. The document which Mr. Leland signed to-day and presented to the governor is as follows:

To His Excellency, E. N. Morrill, Governor of Kansas.

The undersigned hereby charges William Rogers, regent of the Kansas state university, with the following, to-wit:

Charge 1, drunkenness; charge 2, immoral and indecent conduct; charge 3, incompetency.

Specification 1. That William Rogers, while a member of the board of regents of the university of Kansas, has been guilty of drunkenness in the presence of ladies during the winter last past, and while a member of the state senate of the state of Kansas he was frequently under the influence of liquor and drank to excess; that he kept intoxicating liquors in his committee room and drank freely.

Specification 2. That while Rogers, since the commencement of his term of office as regent, has been guilty of immoral and indecent conduct in this, to-wit: That on the 19th day of March, 1895, he was in a boisterous state of intoxication and while in such drunken and maudlin condition, in the presence of ladies, at the

INVASION OF CUBA.

FILIBUSTERING EXPEDITION SAID TO BE ORGANIZING IN NEW YORK.

AN AMERICAN SHIP CHARTERED.

MANY MEN EMPLOYED TO GO AS FIGHTERS AT \$50 PER MONTH.

SPANISH CONSUL HEARD OF IT.

THE PLAN DISCOVERED THROUGH THE WORK OF A DETECTIVE.

Spanish Papers in Madrid Declare That the Governor General of Cuba Is Asking for Reinforcements.—Strong Charges Made by the "Liberal."

New York, March 22.—A sensational story is afloat to the effect that a filibustering expedition is being organized in this city. According to the story, an attempt is being made to fit out a large American schooner for the invasion of Cuba. It is stated that the name of the vessel and the addresses of men who have organized the filibustering expedition are in the hands of the Spanish consul.

It is said that about two weeks ago the Spanish consul was informed that a suspiciously large number of men had been employed to go to Cuba. It was necessary that these men should be citizens of America, otherwise their employers had no work for them. The men were to be given free passage to and from the island, food supplied them, and were to be paid a salary of \$50 per month. Of those who were hired, the ones who appeared to be entirely trustworthy and likely to keep the secret, were told the real nature of the expedition.

The plan was changed, it was said, and it was arranged to send the hired men to Cuba on a steamer of one of the regular lines running to Colon, instead of the chartered steamer. The latter was then to be loaded with munitions of war, and, if possible, the cargo was to be landed on the last end of Cuba, at present the scene of the disturbances. The details of this plan, it was claimed, were learned by a detective who had formerly been in the employ of the Haytian government during the late revolution on the island.

Arturo Badalano, the consul general, was told of the story this evening. He said very decidedly: "There is no word of truth in the story. If such a craft were being fitted out here it would be the greatest of the United States to look after it. The Spanish government would also take the necessary precautions to prevent the success of the expedition. But I know nothing of the matter, and I cannot take any action concerning the matter."

Reinforcements Asked For.

Madrid, March 22.—The Epoca and the Nacional persist in saying that the governor general of Cuba, General Calleja, has asked for reinforcements from the government officials, however, deny the report.

The Liberal accuses the American press of fostering rebellion and hostility to Spain and of partiality to the rebel cause. The Liberal also declares that a quantity of arms and ammunition was landed at Matanzas for the use of the rebels, and that the American press has been endeavoring to induce a more friendly attitude on the part of the American consul at Havana towards the rebels.

Government officials who have been interviewed here by a representative of the Associated Press say they do not believe an American schooner has been sent by a Spanish vessel.

The chief officers of the garrison of Madrid send a deputation to-day to Madrid and the charges will be laid before the government, and there was no question that the Spanish soldiers of all ranks.

Proceedings against certain provincial newspapers, which have been attacking the army, are being taken. The proprietors and editors of some of these papers are to be tried before courts-martial. At least one newspaper has been arrested for attacking a military judge.

Washington, March 22.—It is stated by officials here that the prosecutions of civilian publishers before courts-martial indicate that the charges will be laid before the government, and that the Spanish government will not be deterred by the action of the courts-martial.

CHASE WAS NEATLY NABBED.

Papers Served on the Warden at Lansing by a Clever Ruse—Relieved From Duty.

Leavenworth, Kas., March 22.—(Special.) Warden R. W. Chase, of the Kansas penitentiary, who boasted that he would resist the serving of the order of suspension on him, was trapped very nicely this afternoon by the representatives of Governor Morrill, and the order of suspension was served without the least trouble. He was at once relieved of duty at the penitentiary, and for a moment the official was completely speechless and unable to reply.

Just about that time Deputy Warden Markham started and Sheriff Peterson served on him the order of the governor, which was in charge of the order of suspension. The two prisoners were then turned over to Acting Warden Markham and his assistants, who took a few days' rest from duty. He was very angry at the neat trick that was turned on him, but made no resistance and obeyed the order, even though it was a surprise.

PLEURO-PNEUMONIA IN KANSAS.

This Dread Cattle Disease Prevalent in Geary and One or Two Other Counties.

Topeka, Kas., March 22.—(Special.) The statement of Professor H. S.
