BIG SILVER VICTORY.

THE TRANSMISSISSIPPI CONGRESS DECLARES FOR FREE COINAGE. VOTE MORE THAN TWO TO ONE. MINORITY REPORT FAVORING 'BI-METALLISM' SNOWED UNDER.

Omaha, Nov. 27.—After a five hours' discussion of the financial issues, the trans-mississippi congress declared for the free and unlimited coinage of silver on a 16 to 1 basis, and adjourned at 6 o'clock.

Webster, on behalf of a minority of the committee, presented the following resolutions: 'Resolved, That we are in favor of true bimetalism, which consists in the largest possible use of the silver as a standard money of the country compatible with the purchasing and debt-paying power of the two metals.'
