MYSTERY UNSOLVED

THE WOMAN ACCUSED OF POISONING STILL DECLARES HER INNOCENCE.

SOME SUSPICIOUS INCIDENTS. DOGS DIED OF STRYCHNINE NEAR THE MUSSEY HOUSE.

Funeral Services of the Alleged Victims of Miss Platt—The Friends of the Late James Garvey Take a Last View of His Remains.

The police made little progress yesterday in the investigation of the mystery surrounding the death of the two Mussey children, Sue and Elizabeth, Friday and Saturday. In fact, they made no headway whatever, and are as far away to-day from a solution of the case as they were Saturday, when Coroner Bedford turned the case over to them.

The words of Dr. Neel's appeal to the living, to the large number of persons who were present, were conveyed to two white caskets were conveyed to two white caskets by pallbearers made up of a number of the friends of the deceased.

That they were poisoned is an absolute certainty, as attested by the three well known physicians who were in attendance upon them during their illness. Every symptom tended to show that strychnine had been administered.
