#### MIGHTY IMPETUS FOR EDUCATION

**Baptists Establish Another Female College—College at Greenville Will Not be Removed.**

Laurens, December 2.—The acceptance by the State Baptist convention, in session here, of Anderson's proposition, that a Baptist college for girls be established in Anderson, means that there is to be another college for women in the State, not that Greenville Female college is to be removed from Greenville to Anderson. Anderson has already raised a fund of \$100,000 for the establishment of her college, and has pledged herself to raise \$25,000 more and provide a handsome 20-acre site. Seven of the fifteen trustees elected by the convention to control the institution are residents of Anderson, and several are not Baptists.

Instead of removing the Greenville Female college from Greenville, the convention approved the plans submitted for the enlargement of its plant there and authorized a bond issue of \$75,000 to pay for these betterments. There are already available cash subscriptions to the amount of about \$35,000, so that with the proceeds of the bond issue, more than \$100,000 will be at the disposal of the trustees for overhauling and enlarging the physical plant of the college.

#### U. D. C.'S TO GREENWOOD IN 1911.

**Successful State Convention Closes at Georgetown—Occasion Most Delightful One.**

Georgetown, Dec. 2.—The third and last day's session of the U. D. C.'s convention was opened with prayer, at 9.30 o'clock this morning. Nothing remained to be done, except to decide upon the next place of meeting and the election of officers.

Mrs. A. T. Smythe, on behalf of the Charleston chapter, extended a cordial invitation to the division to meet at Charleston, and another was received from Robert Walter chapter, of Greenwood, which was reinforced by an urgent request from the mayor of that city, that the next convention be held in the interior and hospitable city of Greenwood. Not to be outdone, Georgetown put in her bid most graciously. The ballot was taken on the two former places, and Greenwood won. Thanks of acceptance were at once stretched to the mayor.

The election of officers was then held. Resulting as follows: President, Mrs. August Kohn; first vice-president, Mrs. J. Walter Doar; second vice president, Miss Emily Graham; third vice president, Mrs. D. B. Alexander; fourth vice president, Mrs. Allison Lawton; recording secretary, Mrs. C. J. Milling; corresponding secretary, Miss Alice Earle; treasurer Mrs. M. J. Perry; registrar, Mrs. C. E. Graham; recorder of crosses, Mrs. W. H. Fowler; auditor, Mrs. McCue.

The executive officers of the division are exceedingly efficient in their several offices and the work of the convention was carried on with the utmost harmony and in a rapid manner.

As presiding officer, Mrs. Kohn was businesslike, considerate always, and in every way made an ideal chairman. There were only two changes in the officers, that of Mrs. Lawton and Mrs. McCue.

**Final Adjournment.**

The convention adjourned at 1 o'clock p. m., after the singing of "God be with you till we meet again," and a few words of benediction and Godspeed from the president.
