**MEETING OF COUNTY DEMOCRATIC COMMITTEE**

The county democratic executive committee met on Monday. There was a good attendance but nothing was done except to look over the roll books for duplicates and errors and the adoption of a resolution as to securing the boxes after the ballots have been counted.

Another meeting of the committee will be held next Monday to hear complaints and to appoint managers and to transact other business.

The following resolution was adopted:

Resolved by the Democratic Executive Committee of Newberry County in session this 7th day of August 1916. That the managers of the primary election to be held on the 28th day of August, 1916, and in all second or third primaries that follow, are hereby directed to place around the ballot box, after the ballots have been counted and placed back in the box along with the official tabulation signed by the managers, a paper band covering the key hole and the depositing hole on the top of the box sufficiently broad and strong to cover a space of 2 1/2 inches entirely around the box. Said paper band to be securely glued and not to be broken except in the presence of the Executive Committee in session. The managers to write their names on the band on the top of each box. A full copy of the official tabulation signed by the managers to be placed in a sealed envelope and tied to the box on the outside to be used by the proper officials in the tabulation on the night of the primary. That a piece of manila and sufficient paper tape be placed in each box to enable the managers to comply with the foregoing resolution.
