**Death of Mr. M. G. Clark**

The following is an account of the death of Mrs. J. B. Neel's father, Mr. M. G. Clark, who died in Spartanburg January 23, 1922. Mr. Clark has visited Newberry and had many friends here.

Mr. Clark, one of the oldest and most prominent citizens of the New Prospect community, died on Monday morning, January 23, at about 3 o'clock, at his home on South Paolet. He was born May 7, 1837, and would have been 85 years old at his next birthday. His entire life has been spent in this community, having been born within one mile of his present home. His health has been delicate for several months, yet his sudden death, caused from heart trouble, came as a great shock to his many friends.

Mr. Clark was married January 18, 1866, to Miss Lethea Carpenter of Mills Spring, N. C., having just completed 56 years of married life last Wednesday. He served for a while as a member of Co. F, 13th S. C. V.

Besides his wife he is survived by the following sons and daughters: O. J. Clark of New Prospect; S. P. Clark of Inman; Mrs. J. B. Neel of Newberry; Dr. N. T. Clarke and Mrs. W. W. Brannon of Spartanburg; Mrs. J. W. Keel of Rocky Mount, N. C.

The deceased was one of the most extensive landowners in this section having over 2200 acres. He was a good citizen, who always stood for right, and could always be counted on

the side of law and order and honest government. He had been a member of the Methodist church for 35 years.

Beautiful but simple funeral services were held for M. Garver Clark at his late home near New Prospect on Tuesday afternoon, January 24. The services were conducted by Rev. N. M. Phillips, his present pastor, assisted by the Rev. Ernest Merchant and Mr. O'Neil. Following the services at the home the funeral was concluded at the grave by Chapter 143 of the Masonic order of New Prospect, of which Mr. Clark had been a long and loyal member, assisted by the Inman and Spartanburg lodges.

Both at the home and at the grave there was a large number of lifelong friends to pay honor and tribute to their departed friend, counsellor and adviser. No one in the county was held in higher esteem or loved by those who knew him more than Mr. Clark. His long, noble and useful life was an open book with an example full of inspiration and worthy of emulation for a high standard of correct living. Such is the monument left by the life of this noble and just man.

The many and elegant floral designs spoke the love and esteem of this beloved man.
