Tax Notice.

The County Treasurer's office will be open for the collection of taxes without penalty from the 15th day of October to the 31st day of December inclusive (1907). The levy is as follows: For State, 4 mills; county, 2 1/2 mills; for roads, 1 mill; for constitutional school, 3 mills; polls, \$1. Dog capitation tax, 50c. Also School Districts No. 24 special 1-mill; School Districts Nos. 11, 16, 17, 18 and 23 special 2 mills; Districts Nos. 2, 3, 15, 21, 27, 28 and 10, 3-mill special; Districts Nos. 7, 9, 19, 20, 22 and 26, 4-mill special; District No. 22, 5-mill bond tax. Road tax for 1907, \$2 1/2 per cent, penalty added for month of January, 1908; additional penalty of 1 per cent, for month of February, 1908; additional penalty of 5 per cent, for 15 days in March, 1908.
