

TAX COLLECTOR'S NOTICE.

COUNTY TREASURER'S OFFICE, }
Marion, S. C. Sept. 10, 1909. }
The books for collection of
State, County and Road Tax will
be open from Oct. 15, 1909, to
Dec 31, 1909, those who prefer
to do so can pay State and County
taxes in January, 1910, with 1 per
cent additional; those who prefer
paying in February, 1910, can do
so with 2 per cent additional;
those who prefer paying in March,
1910, to the 15th of said month,
can do so by paying an additional
7 per cent. (After said date
the books will close.)

Road Tax can be paid during
the fall but if those liable prefer
doing so, they can pay the road
tax during January, and Febru-
ary. The commutation tax is \$2
for 1910.

Taxpayers owning property or
paying tax for others will please
ask for a tax receipt in each town-
ship or Special School district in
which he or they own property.
This is very important as there
are so many School Districts.

Those who do not wish to come
to the office can write me (not
later than December 25th) and I
will furnish them: the amount due
and they can remit me by check,
money order, registered letter.

Please do not send me cash
without registering same, as it is
liable to be at sender's risk.

McColl Has an Inventive Genius.

It is not generally known but
McColl has an inventor of no mean
proportions in the person of Mr.
A. E. Squyares, the jeweler.
Among his most important patents
is an automatic switch on the rail-
road track which can be operated
from the engine, without the train
stopping. For this patent a firm
has a 90 day option on it at an
agreed price of \$9,000. His next
and most important invention is
an automatic coupler. By this all
cars can be coupled by the engi-
neer from his engine and the air
connected at the same time. This
has attracted considerable atten-
tion from the railroad people and
has been tested by the Coast Line
on the yards here and pronounced
a success. For this he has refused
an offer of \$20,000, but he has
still another improvement to this
that he has applied for a patent on
which he hopes to secure before
he disposes of his rights in this.
He has also perfected a watch
to run without a hair spring.
His model varied very little in keep-
ing the correct time during 24
hours and he says that an accurate
time piece can be made by him.

but are bona fide offers from large
