Leaving New Bedford for maiden cruise--the Viola was for the sperm whale fishery year--the brig turned up at F. Azores, September 3, with 270 reils of sperm oil to show for summer catch, a rather poor thing it was considered.

At Fayal practically all the ward hands deserted and seven the "after guards" were discharged leaving the craft short handed sailed September 22 for Cape Verde.
