The Panama Revolt.

The proclamation of the province of Panama for an independent provisional government, is in accordance with a threat made that if the Columbia congress adjourned without coming to an agreement with the United States for a canal across the Isthmus, there would be secession.

Congress adjourned and the threat has been made good. Secession may not succeed, but it will give the Columbia government a great deal of trouble. There can be but little question that members of the late congress were trying to speculate off the enterprise and delay a great work wholly from pecuniary reasons, not profitable to its government.

Should the revolution be successful this country can begin operations on the canal. In the meantime our navy and army will see to it that the waterways are kept open and commerce uninterrupted.—Wichita Beacon.

REPUBLICAN CAUCUS.
 Committee to Be Appointed to Reorganize Senate Committees.
 Washington, D. C., Nov. 10.—At a caucus of Republican senators this afternoon Senator Allison, the chairman, appointed a committee to reorganize the senate committees. A resolution was introduced declaring that the committee on the inter-oceanic canal should be a committee with a Republican chairman and a majority of Republicans, but it was not passed. The whole matter was left to the committee on the committees with the understanding that it should take this action. This will displace Morgan as chairman of the inter-oceanic canal committee in the Senate.

STEAMER DESTROYED.

Passengers and Crew are Able to Make Their Way to Parry Sound. Collingwood, Ont., Nov. 10.—The passenger steamer "The Atlantic" was totally destroyed by fire today near Campbell Rocks in the Georgian Bay.
