

TO THE PEOPLE OF ROSWELL.





Do You Eat Oysters.



There used to be just one way to ship oysters. That way was to dump the oysters in an old wooden pail, dump ice water in with the oysters, put in some "embalming" fluid and then the oysters were churned against the ice absorbing all the dirt and impurities until you had a dop-unfit for the stomach of the strongest man.
