COUNTY COMMISSIONERS:

Proceedings of the Board of County Commissioners of Chaves County, New Mexico, at a special meeting thereof, held at the Court House, on Wednesday, August 16th, 1905. The Board met at 9 o'clock a. m. Present: W. M. Atkinson, chairman. Thos. D. White commissioner. N. J. Fritz, commissioner. F. P. Gayle, clerk.

It was ordered that the chairman enter into a contract with the U. S. Government to lease the Court room and office room for the United States Marshal, United States Attorney, United States Judge, United States Clerk, and rooms for the Grand and petit juries, for the year commencing July 1st, 1905, and terminating June 30th, 1906, the consideration to be \$450.00.

The Board proceeded to canvass the election returns for the election held in the town of Hagerman, on Tuesday August 15th, 1905, for the purpose of electing five Town trustees and one Town Marshal, in and for said town of Hagerman, and the following result declared:

For town trustees, there were one hundred eighty-three (183) votes cast of which number N. J. Fritz received twenty-three (23); O. R. Tanner received twenty-one (21); M. C. Moore received twenty-four (24); J. W. Langford received twenty-nine (29); E. C. Miller received twenty-one (21); A. R. Teeple received twenty-one (21); W. E. Bowen received eighteen (18); Perry Wagon received ten (10); C. F. White received ten (10); and Frank Anderson six (6).

The count showing a tie between A. R. Teeple, O. R. Tanner and E. C. Miller, Mr. A. R. Teeple voluntarily withdrew his name from the list of candidates and N. J. Fritz, O. R. Tanner, M. C. Moore, J. W. Langford and E. C. Miller were declared elected and certificates of election ordered issued them by the clerk of this Board.

For town marshal there were thirty-six (36) votes cast, of which number D. L. Lang received twenty-seven (27); and Jim Frost received nine (9).

D. L. Lang was declared elected and certificate of election ordered issued him by the clerk of this board. It having been reported to the board that the bridge across the Rio Felix near the town of Hagerman, has been destroyed by flood, it is ordered that N. J. Fritz, chairman, J. W. Langford and E. D. Balcom be and they are hereby appointed a committee to select a location to build a bridge across said Rio Felix as near by the location of the bridge destroyed as practicable, and to report the probable cost and recommend plans of said bridge, and it is further ordered that Mark Howell be and he is hereby appointed as Consulting and Locating Engineer, to assist said committee.

No further business appearing, the board adjourned.
