GOVERNOR BARNES.

Some Incidents of His Life as Told by Himself.

Governor Barnes is rather proud of the fact that he is considerable of a westerner. It is not generally known that he was in Leavenworth, Kansas, in 1857. However, he was in that city at the age of twelve—a telegraph operator.

When asked to tell the story of his life Governor Barnes does it in a snappy way with a casual abandon of all details and an utter disregard for dates. He was born in New York and at a very early age was brought into Michigan, when an older brother taught him telegraphy. He then set out at the age of twelve for himself. There was no protest on the part of his parents, evidently, for he mentions none and in telling it did not see anything remarkable in a boy of twelve coming as far west in 1857 as Leavenworth, alone, and embarking in a profession. He afterwards went into St. Louis. When the war broke out most of the telegraphers were "seceded" but Barnes, being loyal, General Lyons used him as an operator and a private secretary in the Wilson creek campaign. After, on an order from Fremont, Barnes joined a company of independent engineers in Michigan. This was afterward disbanded and the members signed and re-enlisted. After the war Governor Barnes was sent to Little Rock by his commander on some detail of army business. "And," said Governor Barnes yesterday, "on the street there in Little Rock I saw a pretty, black-eyed girl, resolved that I would marry her and afterward did."

"In fact, that is Governor Barnes' style of conversation throughout. He is a thorough politician, careful not to offend, but impervious to any man's bluff no matter how big it is. He prides himself on his Republicanism, Eagle
