

MANY INSTITUTIONS HAVE BEEN CHARTERED

What the Records in the Territorial Secretary's Office Show

A review of the records since January 1, 1902, in the office of W. M. Grimes, territorial secretary, shows a phenomenal growth in the establishment of territorial institutions. The list of corporation charters given below have all been granted in less than five months time and show the wonderful improvement which is being made in the territory along every line of industry.

The aggregate capital stock of the corporations which have been chartered since the first of the year is over \$100,000,000. The territory has made more progress during the past six months than during any previous six months since the opening of the country.
