THE BLACKWELL GAS WELL.

Stockholders Meet and Elect Directors and Officers.

Blackwell, Okla., March 28.—The gas well people held a well attended meeting Wednesday night in the city hall and elected the following directors: J. W. Beatty, J. L. Waite, J. W. Pickett, J. W. Randall, D. S. Rose, G. W. Kiffe and J. M. Skelton. It was voted to employ a superintendent in order to facilitate the work on the well. The meeting adjourned without electing officers. This morning the newly elected directors met in the office of Tetrick & Rose and elected the following officers:

J. L. Waite, president; J. W. Randall, vice president; J. W. Beatty, secretary and superintendent; J. M. Skelton, treasurer.

The location for the new well has been decided on and will be about 800 feet southwest of the present one. Lumber has been bought for the purpose of erecting another derrick which will be at once constructed, and the work of sinking the well will begin without any unnecessary delay. The flow of gas in the well that has been sunk continues unabated, with no indication of falling or becoming weaker.

Gas Company Organized at Shawnee.
Shawnee, Okla., March 28.—The Shawnee Gas company was duly organized last week and elected the following board of directors: Sheldon R. Williams, W. S. Search, J. C. Fisher, F. P. Stearns and Theo. Rankin. Sheldon R. Williams was made president of the company, W. S. Search, vice president and J. C. Fisher, general manager. Work on the streets was resumed this morning and in a few days there will be a large number of men at work. A location for the buildings has been secured and the erection of them will be commenced early next week. It is expected by the management to be able to furnish gas to the citizens of Shawnee by June 1st.

VALUE OF CLAIM NO. 1.

District Court at Lawton to Decide Value in Condemnation.

Lawton, Okla., March 28.—The Woods addition condemnation case was brought up in the district court last week. The members of the jury were taken out this morning to look over the land in question. Before the land in question. Before the building of the Oklahoma City & Western railroad, now a part of the Frisco system, over this land, a board of three members was appointed by the secretary of the interior to make an award of the damage the land would sustain by the building of the road over it.


