WIND UP TRIBAL AFFAIRS

Congressman Charles Carter will introduce a bill during the short session of Congress looking to the termination of affairs of the five civilized Indian tribes within the next three or five years. The legislation will also involve sale of the segregated coal and asphalt lands of the Chickasaw-Choctaw nation, but its details have not been determined. Sale would be either in bulk or piecemeal as would be the most advantageous, in any event under the direction of the Interior department. The bill is based upon the fact that the Indians are now citizens of the State as well as upon the various treaty stipulations that such end shall be reached as soon as possible. The last Curtis act, it is said, prevented the desired change.

In case the government grants authority for the sale of the coal and asphalt lands it is probable the state will be an applicant to purchase. A commission named by the Congressional committee reported favorably upon the feasibility of state ownership, however, held it was first necessary for the Indians to have authority to sell and to this end a memorial was sent to Congress by the first Legislature. The memorial was not heard of since being presented. Congressman Carter does not favor placing an upset price on the land, but wants the Indian to obtain the best figure possible.

GMELICH'S MAJORITY THIRTY

Jefferson City, Mo., Nov. 21.—On the face of the official returns, including precinct corrections, Jacob F. Gmelich, republican, was elected lieutenant governor by 29 votes, and the other minor republican candidates were defeated.

This vote does not include amended returns which give Paynter a net gain of 63 and if counted for him in the legislature will elect him by 33 votes. The legislature must cast up the official vote, declare what returns shall be counted and the result. The lieutenant governor is the only office in doubt.

The corrected vote on governor follows: Hadley, Republican, 255,932; Cowbird, Democrat, 245,053. Hadley's majority, 10,879.
