BRUTE ATTACKS GIRL OF EIGHT; POSSE PURSUE


FARMERS AND MERCHANTS OF SALLISAW ARE HUNTING FOR BOY OF 20

Sallisaw, May 20.—Long after midnight more than a hundred grimacing farmers and business men of this vicinity, everyone armed with some kind of a gun, tramped the streets of Sallisaw, angry because Sheriff C. M. Gay had succeeded in spirited Sidney Moneyham, white, 22 years old, away to Tahlequah before he could be lynched.

Moneyham is accused of a statutory offense against Addie Gilbert, 8 years old, the daughter of Mr. and Mrs. L. Gilbert. Gilbert is the proprietor of the Phoenix Hotel, where the boy is employed. He is on duty at night and sleeps in the daytime. The girl was sent to his room at the hotel just before supper to wake him.

In a few minutes the girl ran down the stairs screaming for her mother. When quieted she said that Moneyham had called her into the room and had attempted to choke her. Before anything could be done the youth dashed down the steps, out of the hotel and through the town. The alarm was given at once and after a chase that lasted for a quarter of a mile, Moneyham was captured near the Kansas City Southern Railroad station by City Marshal Agent. Gilbert is wealthy and comes from a prominent family. No sooner had the news gotten out than a mob began to form and there was much talk of lynching. Fearing that he would be unable to control the mob, Sheriff Gay took the prisoner to Tahlequah, where he is being held.

Moneyham will be lynched if officers attempt to bring him back for a preliminary hearing, which has been set for Friday.

MEN WHO CACHED BOOZE IN CAVE MUST SERVE TIME

FEDERAL COURT OF APPEALS UPHOLDS JUDGE COTTERAL IN SENTENCES NOTED CASE

Judge John H. Cotteral was notified today that the federal circuit court of appeals at St. Paul has reversed the decision of Judge J. C. Pollock in the habeas corpus case of D. A. Ward and W. A. Greenwood.

The two men were charged with introducing liquor on Indian allotments, and were tried before Federal Judge J. H. Cotteral in April, 1914. They were convicted of having a plant, near Avant, in the Osage country, where they had arranged a large cave with secret storage rooms, electric alarms and other fixtures for a large liquor business.

The trial court sentenced each to serve two years in the federal prison and to pay a fine of \$300. A few weeks after they were taken to Leavenworth, Judge Pollock released them on the theory that they were convicted under the act of Jan. 30, 1887, which provided a minimum sentence of sixty days and \$100 fine, but having no maximum provision they could not be sentenced in excess of the minimum penalty. The government appealed from the decision of Judge Pollock to the United States circuit court of appeals, on the theory that the act of 1887 was valid standing

alone, and further that it was amendatory to another federal statute. The circuit court in sustaining the government's theory ordered the return of Ward and Greenwood to the federal penitentiary.
