PUBLIC BUILDINGS WILL BE HARD TO GET IN THE FUTURE

Washington, D. C., Nov. 13.—Congressman Jim McHattie tried to prevail upon Assistant Secretary of the Treasury Newton this week to agree to the building of a federal building at Frederick, Okla., upon a site already chosen, but received little encouragement. The government intends slowing down in the matter of federal buildings construction except in cities where buildings are absolutely necessary to the efficient and economical handling of government business. At the present time the government pays about \$400 a year rent for postoffice quarters at Frederick, while the receipts of the office are only about \$10,000 a year.

It is beginning to look as if the Oklahoma cities that already have federal buildings, or in course of construction, are getting off lucky than the towns which are still clamoring for buildings.

To Organize New Bank.

The comptroller of the currency is in receipt of an application from C. O. Alford, G. A. Smith, B. E. Hall, O. S. Landes, J. A. Fowler and M. M. Landes to organize the First National bank of DeWol, Okla., with a capital of \$25,000.

Changes in fourth-class Oklahoma postmasters are announced as follows: Meramec, Pawnee county, George C. Thomas, vice Lewis E. Watkins, resigned; Reagan, Johnston county, John F. Alexander, vice W. E. Smith, resigned.

New Motor Mail Routes.

The postoffice department announces the establishment of the following new motor vehicle rural mail routes in Kiowa county, Okla., service upon which will begin January 1:

Gore Favors Tariff Commission.

In order that the foreign trade of the United States may be facilitated instead of hampered, Senator Gore of Oklahoma has announced that he will reintroduce at the convening of congress a bill for the creation of an investigate the cost of production at home and abroad, to study tariff treaties and to otherwise assist in stimulating foreign trade. Several changes will be made in the bill introduced by Mr. Gore at the last session of congress and there will be a strong combination behind the Gore bill, or some similar measure, to bring about better tariff regulations in the United States.

River Congress Date Set.

Invitations are being sent out for the twelfth annual convention of the national rivers and harbors congress to be held in Washington, December 8 to 15. Senator Joseph M. Randall of Louisiana, who is already pledged to the improvement of the Arkansas river, is president of the congress, and is desirous that Muskogee, Tulsa and other Oklahoma towns bordering on the river send delegations to this year's meeting.

Reynolds Case Appealed.

Former Governor C. N. Haskell of Muskogee, who lost out in the supreme court of the District of Columbia in an attempt to mandamus Secretary of the Interior Lane to compel him to consider the lease made by Anty-Reynolds, a fullblood Creek Indian of McIntosh county, Okla., to W. S. Morris of Tulsa, in order to test rule 5, which does not permit the acquisition of a restricted Indian oil lease by any person holding 4800 acres of restricted Indian lands, has appealed to the district court of appeals. In any event the case will be carried to the United States supreme court for final determination as to the powers of the secretary of the interior to promulgate rules which the oil men claim were unauthorized by congress, such as the case with the 4800 acre leasing restriction.
