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ARGENTINE WILL NEW WOODMEN INVESTIGATE RATES UPHELD FLOUR PRICE BY U. S. COURT

AFTER PAYING CARRIAGE ATTEMPT TO SECURE IN AND DUTY U. S. PRODUCT IS CHEAPEST MEETS WITH FAILURE

(By Associated Press.)
Chicago, Nov. 18.—Arguments on the petition of Isadore Brown, who seeks a temporary injunction to restrain the Woodmen of the World, the great fraternal organization, from increasing its rates, were begun Wednesday before Judge Windes in the circuit court and continued today. Samuel J. Andaman and Charles C. W. Miller represent the organization.

"The Woodmen of the World is the second largest institution of its kind in existence," Attorney Miller said in explaining the suit from the viewpoint of the Woodmen. "The order has between 750,000 and 1,000,000 members. When the order decided to increase rates it took time by the forelock. In line with other large organizations which have increased their rates."

"An educational movement has been under way among organizations to place them on a sounder basis. The reserve fund of the Woodmen of the World totals \$25,000,000, the outstanding insurance obligations are \$75,000,000 and the rates of insurance have been too low to perpetuate the institution. This does not mean, though, that the order is in any danger or that any is expected to arise."

Judge Windes this evening denied the petition for an injunction, holding that increased rates were absolutely vital to the life of the society.

Local importers of well known American and European products are also much exercised over the fact that trade marks and labels of their products are being forged successfully on a large scale to cover a very prosperous but illegitimate business, especially in the food and drug line. Numerous raids have been made upon premises where these falsifications have been carried on, but up to the present there have been no prosecutions, and there is a feeling among importers that the government has not been very zealous in defending their interests.

An additional American trade note is found in the announcement that American capitalists are to erect here a new refrigerating establishment, a site for which has been chosen at South Dock, where a most modern structure will be built, complete with all the latest devices for dealing with cattle, sheep and hogs. This is but one of a number of indications that American progress is becoming more marked in Buenos Aires.

or literacy tests. These same sections seem to be most under the domination of the "shylocks and usurers," and the same members who are wanting the election law reform are arguing with Governor Williams against pressing the usury laws. The governor has his program made up and it now has become a matter of security pledges enough to carry the platform through as a whole or there will be no call for a special session of the legislature.

Kinds of Laws Wanted.
Governor Williams has told the bankers and the members who represent the attitude of the bankers as to the usury question that he wants a usury law that will make it the duty of the county attorney to prosecute all actions in behalf of individuals complaining against usury and the penalty recovered shall belong to the county attorney as a fee and the other shall go to the county general revenue fund. The victim of the usurer

to be relieved of making any payment either of principal or interest. He insists upon a law that will put a stop to usury.

The attitude of several of the closest friends of the governor in the legislature has shown that they may have to choose between their own political future and their loyalty to the governor. Some of these are standing firm with him and urging the special session, being willing to assist in effecting the usury law, although threatened by their local usurers with political oblivion through the influence of the bankers.

OKLAHOMA WINS HIGHWAY VICTORY

New Orleans, La., Nov. 18.—The board of directors of the Jefferson Highway association have finally selected a tentative route through Louisiana, Texas, Oklahoma, Missouri, Iowa and Minnesota for the proposed international highway from New Orleans to Winnipeg, Canada.

The route selected, which it was announced was subject to minor changes, passes through Baton Rouge, Alexandria and Shreveport, La.; Denison, Texas; Muskogee, Okla.; Joplin, Kansas City and St. Joseph, Mo.; Des Moines, Iowa; St. Paul and Minneapolis, Minn., and thence to Winnipeg. The route through Texas and Oklahoma, it is said, would include the Katy highway, and from Kansas City to St. Paul the Interstate trail.
