BRITAIN PAYS BIG PREMIUM FOR WAR LOAN

PUTS UP \$300,000,000 TO SECURE LOAN OF \$250,000,000

New York, Aug. 19.—J. P. Morgan & Co. today announced the terms of the new \$250,000,000 British loan, which is at 5 per cent for two years.

The agreement requires the deposit here by Great Britain of \$300,000,000 in securities of the highest grade to secure the loan. It further provides that if at any time the market value of the deposited securities depreciates others will be added sufficient to keep the value of the securities 20 per cent above the amount of the loan.

This is the first time Great Britain has been forced to place securities here as collateral for a loan.

The \$300,000,000 collateral must include \$100,000,000 worth of American securities, \$100,000,000 of securities of the Canadian government or the Canadian Pacific Railway, and \$100,000,000 in securities either issued or guaranteed by the governments of Argentina, Chile, Norway, Sweden, Switzerland, Denmark or Holland.

Pending the arrival and deposit of a portion of these securities the British government is to deposit temporarily with the Farmers' Loan and Trust company either approved New York Stock Exchange collateral or cash or both.

\$1,500,000,000 Loans to Allies.

The loan will be offered to the public at 5 and bear 5 per cent interest. It matures August 31, 1918. It may be redeemable at the option of the borrowers at 101 and interest August 31, 1917, or at 101 1/2 and interest, August 31, 1918.

This is the fourth large loan to be floated in this country in the past year by foreign governments. The Anglo-French loan of \$500,000,000 was sold last October, the \$50,000,000 Russian credit in June and the \$100,000,000 French secured loan last month.

Although the amount involved in the loans which the United States has made to European and South American nations since the war began is \$1,500,000,000.

WILL USE MEDICINE TO CIVILIZE MOROS

PHILIPPINE GOVERNMENT WILL SEND HOSPITAL SHIP TO SULU ARCHIPELAGO

New York, Aug. 19.—In an attempt to advance civilization through the medium of medical relief, the Philippine government co-operating with the International Health Board of the Rockefeller Foundation it was announced here last night, will send a hospital ship to the Sulu Archipelago, inhabited by approximately 200,000 Moros and other savage tribes. The medical service will be maintained five years.

Investigation has shown the Moros to be suffering from skin diseases of severe form, malaria, hookworm disease, dysentery and other preventable infections. As the Igorotes and other head-hunting tribes of Northern Luzon were civilized largely by the men who brought them medical relief, it was decided to reach the Moros in the same way. The hospital ship will go from island to island, meeting the people at established points, bringing medical relief to the sick, training midwives and giving general instruction to the natives.

Pittsburg, Aug. 19.—Hidden on the hand while showing a den of rattlesnakes to a class of students from the University of Pittsburg, yesterday, Gustav Link, for nineteen years taxidermist at Carnegie Institute here died today.

Link concealed the fact that he had been bitten, until after the class had left his room, when he told his assistants. He was hurried to a hospital and there being no serum in the city to counteract the poison, two tubes were ordered from New York. They did not arrive until too late.

COUNTRY NOW FACING GRAVE CAR SHORTAGE

Chicago, Aug. 19.—Railroads and shippers this fall and winter will face one of the worst shortages of freight cars in the history of the country, unless unexpected and radical changes are made in industrial commercial and transportation conditions, according to a review published by the Rail Way Age Gazette today.

The gross car shortage reported on August 1 is the largest and the gross surplus and net surplus the smallest ever reported on that date, the publication says.

"The net surplus on that date was only 16,616 cars," the paper continues. "The smallest net surplus previously reported on August 1 was that of 1907 which was 27,836 cars, and in the fall of that year there was a severe car shortage, the net shortage rising to 86,800 cars.

"There are enough cars to handle the country's business if only they shall be handled with care and efficiency."
