DELINQUENT TAX PAYERS OF 1873-ATTENTION.

The time has come when the Collector may seize property and sell it for taxes. No property is exempt from seizure and sale, and all costs of seizing and selling must be paid by the tax payer in addition to the taxes. On the first day of January, 1874, a penalty of five per cent. must be added to every tax, and on the first day of February a penalty of ten per cent. must be added to every tax uncollected at those times. I am now preparing to make seizures, and shall commence on the 25th day of the present month to force the payment of all unpaid taxes for the year 1873.
