TROOPS JOINED THE INSURGENTS.

A special to the Citizen Jacksonville, Fla., from Key West says: News has been received here that the troops of the Spanish garrison at San Jose de Las Lajas, twenty miles southwest of Havana, abandoned their post and joined the insurgents.

News from Santiago de Cuba reports that the insurgents captured an important Spanish convoy of ammunition and supplies between Bayamo and Manilla with nearly 1,000,000 rounds of 7mm and Remington cartridges.

No more social or family gatherings will be held in Havana unless special orders shall be secured from the authorities. All of the homes of Cuban families are watched as well as the movements of foreign correspondents and are reported to the police.

The post-office officials upon letters indiscriminately and send them to owners without excuse. Outgoing passengers when suspected are searched aboard the ships and steamships officials are closely watched.

The Texas Was Floated. The New York World says: The battleship Texas, which has been undergoing repairs for two weeks, was floated out of the timber dry dock early yesterday morning and with the assistance of two government tugs was moored at the Cob dock. The ship is in for service and will in all probability be put out of commission in the near future and undergo extensive alterations.

Besides the weakness of the bulk-head, the water-tight compartment of the apparatus which works in 12 inch guns, the turret is found to have been so faultily constructed that the guns cannot be loaded from two positions. Should the turret, become jammed the guns would be useless.

Many other defects have also been discovered. The pin gear to the hoisting and hammer gear is unprotected when it traverses the space between the protective deck and the floor of the turret. This means that the main battery can be disabled by a shot from a small gun.

Another Big Will Contest. A contest has begun at San Francisco over a three million dollar estate of John Z. Davis, who died recently at Philadelphia. The contestants are Rev. Joseph P. Wilson, a Methodist minister of West Virginia, and Mrs. Catherine Steel, respectively the wife and niece of Davis.

The contestants state that their uncle's true name was not Davis but Dediker, and that he changed his name when he came to California, in 1849, that he might conceal his identity and thereby escape from an apprenticeship. His entire estate was left to two nieces of his wife, Lizzie Mulr and Belle Curtis, and the contestants claim to be the only blood relatives of the heirs of Davis. They allege mental unsoundness and undue influence as ground for the contest.

Fall of a Meteor. The German oil tank steamer Wikomien, which arrived at New York from Dantz, bringing six thousand bags of best sugar, reports that shortly after midnight on the 17th a bright meteor shot across the sky from southeast to northwest and plunged hissing into the sea, some distance ahead of the Wikomien. Almost immediately after a huge sea, like a tidal wave, broke over the steamer's bow and swept aft, doing only slight damage. The bringing of beet sugar to this port on oil tanks is an experiment which will be watched with interest. This is the first consignment to arrive, and on the condition of the sugar when unloaded will depend future shipments.

A Pullman car conductor who arrived yesterday over the National reports that the blizzard that has just swept over the states reached as far south as Saitillo and that there was snow on the ground all the way from San Antonio to Saitillo.—Two Republics.

LIFE SAVING WORK.

Report of the Superintendent of the Life Saving Service. The report of Mr. Kimball, the superintendent of the life saving service, for the year ending June 30 shows the most satisfactory results yet secured. Although the total number of wrecks was greater than in any previous year, the percentage of lives saved and property saved was greater. During the year 296 new stations were located on the Gulf and Atlantic coasts, 55 on the great lakes and 77 on the Pacific coast.

There were also during the year 236 casualties to unadorned small craft and sail boats. Of the 556 persons on board 47 were saved and seven lost. The value of the property in these casualties was estimated at \$1,199,429, of which \$110,945 was saved. The total number of shipwrecked persons survived at stations was 613. The total number of days' succor afforded was 1436.

Other persons (on board vessels) to the number of eighty-two were saved from drowning, of whom would probably have perished but for the vigilance and promptness of the life saving crews. During the year the crews saved and assisted to save 472 vessels, valued with their cargoes at \$8,523,110. Of this number 317 were saved without outside assistance aggregating with their cargoes a value of \$7,500,000. In the remaining instances the life saving crews assisted other agencies in saving property valued at \$1,179,000, out of a total of \$3,179,000 imperiled. Assistance was also rendered to vessels in distress. The pilots were also warned from distress by night signals and day signals. The loss of life and property averted in the 329 instances thus saved cannot of course be estimated, but from the large number of wrecks made it is indicated that it must have been very considerable.

Attention is invited to the inadequacy of the compensation of station attendants of life saving districts and their crews.
