A WORTHY ORGANIZATION.
The American Guild of Organists has been organized in New York.
An institution that is ere long bound to make its influence felt for marked good in the musical world, has been organized in New York with a membership that is including the best organists in the United States. The institution is the American Guild of Organists, incorporated under the laws of the state of New York, and whose aim is to foster and encourage the development of church music in its highest and noblest sense.

For the greater glory of God, and for the good of his holy church in this land, we, being several members of the American Guild of Organists do declare our mind and intention in the things following:
We believe that the office of music in Christian worship is a sacred obligation before the Most High.

We believe that they who are set as choirmasters and organists in the house of God ought themselves to be persons of devout conduct, teaching the ways of earnestness in the choir committed to their charge.

We believe that unity of purpose and fellowship of life between ministers and choir should be everywhere established and maintained. We believe that at all times and in all places it is meet, right, and our bounden duty to work together for the advancement of Christian worship in the holy gifts of strength and nobleness; to the end that the minds of men may be instructed, to the honor of God's house may be guarded in our time, and in the time to come.

Wherefore, do we give ourselves with reverence and humility to these endeavors, offering up our works and our persons in the name of him, without whom nothing is strong, nothing is holy. Amen.

The Guild recently held a public meeting in St. Bartholomew's church in New York City, where it was addressed by Bishop Potter. The bishop made a stirring address, in which he said: Musical art does not exist for itself, but that it may lift the souls of the poor, the weak, the sinful, and the sorrowing to a higher living, and closer relations to the divine. Even worship is not an end, but a means to an end, and music has a great power to bring to the mind a consciousness of the assistance of our need and the nobleness of succor and help. The organist's calling then is great and august, and filippany in either life or work is peculiarly incongruous.

There are thoughts and emotions that can find no expression in words, and music can often hush the irreverent and induce in them a worshipful spirit. The words strength and nobleness in the declaration of principles are suggestive. Worship music should have body and solidity, not thinness and catchiness; it should be strong and therefore inspiring. The union of effort and noble ideas will be helpful in many ways; yet the membership should not forget its duty to bear with and concede something to the overbearing music committee and often ignorant pastor. Yield a point to the pastor, but do not give up the having a tune announced that the people will sing, but do it with a reservation; resolve to lift the taste by degrees as it can be done. The portrait of a noble man may not be a picture or display of character, but the Guild will admit to its membership only performers of the highest attainment and uprightness of character, and that is what will make it such a power for good in its special sphere. Already members take a just pride in affixing A. G. O. to their names, for this means something. It is expected that the Guild will ultimately be empowered to confer degrees; and it now holds examinations and gives certificates corresponding to the character of the examination passed.

Stay at Home.
Gen. B. T. Johnson says: "There is not the slightest sense in the world in young Americans going to Cuba. They are not needed or wanted by the Cubans. All the insurgents want are arms and medicines. The Cubans can carry on a guerilla warfare for months to come. Their war is one of devastation of property; the Spanish war is of extermination of the Cubans. Our young men will find no opportunity to battle as they might expect—no chance to win military honors and renown. When they enter the insurgents' ranks they will find themselves herded with negroes and their military engagements will be the occasional ambushments of detached bodies of Spanish soldiers and the destruction of property throughout the country. It is no use going to Cuba, my friends. You are of more value than the whole of the people on that island. There is no fighting. I could take an American regiment there and clean out Weyler in short order."
