Brewer of the United States circuit court decided that the company has fenced in about 52 000 scres of land belonging to the gevernment. The suit was brought by the latter to compel the company to tear down the fences. The decision is in effect that the Brighton Ranch company have no right to build fences on government land and the government has absolute right to have the fences removed if it sees fit to exercise that privilege. He granted a temporary injunction enjoining the defendants from the construction of any additional or cross fences on the lands so inclosed, but said that he would await a final hearing before issuing a mandatory injunction requiring the removal of the fence.
