The Storm.

THE WINTER BEGUN IN EARNEST.
SAINT PAUL, MINN., Dec. 5.—Snow began to fall early yesterday morning, and the weather is gradually getting colder. The storm was accompanied with winds which blew snow in gales, making the day savor of genuine winter for the first time this season. Reports received by signal officers show that the storm was general throughout Manitoba, Dakota, Minnesota, Eastern Montana and Northern Wisconsin. Considerable snow fell at Duluth last night. How far south the storm extends has not yet been learned. The following reports have been received at various railroad offices: Omaha and Black River Falls, snowing and drifting two inches on the ground; snowing and blowing hard over the entire length of the St. Paul & Sioux City division. No snow west of Luverne. Trains are all right.

CAME TO LYNCH HIM.

A HORN COUNTY MOB BALKED IN THEIR PURPOSE.

GREENVILLE, TEX., Dec. 5.—This morning between 12 and 1 o'clock a mob of about fifty mounted and well-armed men went to the jail and demanded of Mr. M. Adair, the jailer, the surrender of one Henry Schamberger, and said they would give him ten minutes in which to surrender him. He gave the alarm, which brought the night police-man, John Stevens, to the jail, and as soon as he found out what was the matter he ran to the fire bell and commenced to give the alarm of fire, which had a good effect and drove the mob away. Policeman Stevens attempted to arrest several of them and several shots were fired but no one was hurt as yet heard of. One horse was shot through the neck and died dead this morning in the road a half mile from the jail.

A father and son are both confined in the same cage in the Waco jail. The father is old Jerry Reaga, indicted for murder, and his son, fourteen years old, arrested this morning for street stealing. The old man gave the boy a severe lecture on the evil of his ways.

The colored Baptists laid the cornerstone of a new church this afternoon. Rev. Dr. Carroll, of the white Baptist church, delivered an address. The church is to be of brick, with a steeple ninety feet high, stained glass windows, and will cost about \$8000.

A great deal of interest is felt here in

the outcome of Tom P. Varnell's habeas corpus trial, which is going on at Hillsboro to-day. Miss Emma Land will be there to testify. She is the daughter whom Varnell is said to have assaulted.

Cotton receipts have been fair to-day.

Total receipts since September 1 aggregate \$55,600 bales. The stock on hand is about 4000 bales.

The criminal docket is at a standstill in the district court. The lawyers had no cases ready yesterday or to-day, and court adjourned until Monday.

The weather has been several degrees colder to-day on account of a severe norther that prevailed last night.

In East Waco the Houston & Texas Central Railway company have had a gang digging a well. They had reached about twenty-eight feet down, with twenty-feet of curbing, this afternoon about 5 o'clock, when the well caved, catching several workmen in the well. It caved the second time, carrying with it the heavy timbers and the pumps. Levi Moore, colored, was buried out of sight, and has not yet been dug out. John Robertis, white, from Houston, and Jake Childs have been taken out, Robertis being seriously hurt. Jim Jackson, another colored man, was hurt. Charlie Clark, the foreman of the gang, is caught by the right leg in the timbers, and willing hands are at work trying to saw the timbers to get him out. It is feared the well will continue to cave, as it is light, sandy soil, and quicksand had been reached, which was the cause of the caving in of the curbing.

INDIAN AFFAIRS.

MISTAKEN IDENTITY.

WILCOX, A. T., Dec. 5.—It is just learned that Sheriff Crawford of Graham county, who was reported killed by the Indians, is alive. The mutilated remains of another murdered man, named Kelton, had been mistaken for him.

THE APACHES IN ARIZONA.

TOMBSTONE, A. T., Dec. 5.—William Herring of this city, who has just returned from the vicinity of Fort Bowie,

reports that the military at that post fear

an attack from the hostile Apaches for the purpose of rescuing their squaws held as prisoners there. This prevents a larger force being sent out from the fort in pursuit of the hostiles. It is also reported that the Indians raided Storr's and McGinnis' ranches near Fort Bowie.

THE PIEGAN OF THEIR RESERVATION.

OMAHA, NEB., Dec. 5.—The reports at army headquarters show that the Piegan Indians are again off their reservation in Wyoming, and are making it uncomfortable for settlers and neighboring Indians.

About a week ago a band of Piegan marauders ran off a herd of 400 horses

from the ranch of Plenty Caves of Sweet Grass creek. After a four days' chase

Caves and his men overtook the thieves

near Crazy mountain, and after a short battle recovered all but fifty horses, and killed one Indian.
