**State Banks are Solid.**

From careful reading of the charges upon which Commissioner of Banking and Insurance Austin was indicted in Travis County, one must see that his violation of the law is only technical. There seems to be no proof that he has taken any money from the public till, but merely failed to deposit with the treasurer as promptly as the law stipulates. There has been fear expressed that the indictment may cause suspicion of the state banking system, but assurance comes that the state banks are thoroughly safeguarded and there is no need of any lack of public confidence in them.

An Austin special says: "Almost conclusive evidence of the increasing conservatism of the 855 state banks in Texas is shown in the cash reserve on hand at the present time, according to Chas. O. Austin, state commissioner of Insurance and Banking. He says the present cash reserve amounts to 41 per cent of liabilities as against 27 per cent last year and 27 per cent the year previous.

**AMENDMENT TO BE VOTED UPON AUGUST TWENTY-FIRST**

An election will be held throughout Texas, August 21, to decide whether the State constitution will be so amended as to conserve our natural resources by reclamation, through flood control, irrigation impounding waters, drainage, etc.

Under the present constitution reclamation or improvement districts can be formed and bonds for such purposes voted but the territory embraced cannot be for more than one county. And the administrative authority given the county officers is too limited to secure adequate results, even if this limited area would be sufficient.

The proposed amendment announces a policy that reclamation and preservation of all natural resources, including flood control, irrigation, impounding waters, drainage, etc. can and should be done in a much broader basis. It provides a way for one or more counties to form a district and for the property owners of such district to vote bonds for these purposes, and authorizes the legislature to enact laws that will make effective such means, as aforesaid. When bonds are voted in districts thus formed, it will place the burden in the proper proportion upon property owners, and it will give such property owners a right to conserve their interests in any of the above ideas of conservation.
