

CANCER NOW CURED BY RADIUM

Eastern Physicians Tell of Healing Growths in 48 Hours by Rays

PHILADELPHIA, Dec. 16.—Cancer is curable and cancerous growths which had resisted every other treatment invented by science have been cured in 48 hours by the marvelous properties of radium.
