Take Notice!

That all licenses granted by the Mayor, as required by the ordinances of the city of Maysville, shall become

Due on the 1st Day of January in Each Year, and Shall be Considered Delinquent if Not Paid by the 1st day of February Thereafter.

That if any person shall operate or carry on any business, occupation or calling, or do any act for which a license is required without first obtaining a license, such person or persons shall be fined not less than \$20 nor more than \$100 for each offense.

That the addition of any penalty to a license shall not exempt the person from whom said license may be collectable, from any penalty to which he or she may be liable for violation of any of the provisions of the ordinances of the city in regard to licenses.

The following occupations and articles are subject to license at the rates named:
