WHAT DO YOU SAY NOW

Does This Look Like Colonel Boone Was a "Fraud?"

BLACK DIAMOND WILL BE BUILT

Forty Directors, including Colonel A. E. Boone and others who have been instrumental in securing franchises and subscriptions for the Black Diamond Railroad in the various states through which the road will run, met at the Grand Hotel yesterday to confer with T. C. Dickinson of Washington, D. C.

Mr. Dickinson is the financial promoter of the enterprise, and he has just returned from a conference with Sir Thomas Tanager, the eminent engineer of London. Mr. Dickinson last night informed a Commercial Tribune reporter that the meeting with the Directors yesterday was entirely satisfactory, and that nothing stands in the way of the early success of the enterprise.

"The English capitalists represented by Sir Thomas Tanager," Mr. Dickinson declared, "acting on the unqualifiedly favorable report made by Sir Thomas, have agreed to finance the preliminary work on the section of the road between Clay City, Ky., at the edge of the 250 miles of coal fields, and we hope to have all details finished and begin work within three months. The road from there to the terminus, Port Royal, S. C., we hope to have finished within a year.

"There will be strong American capitalists interested with the English in the enterprise, and it is our hope that the entire line, 1,235 miles in length, will be completed within three years. The main line, 800 miles in length, runs between Columbus, O., and Port Royal, and there are branch lines to Vincennes and Greenfield, Ind. Cincinnati is also on one of the branch lines.

"We consider that the success of the enterprise is assured, and that the great double-track trunk line is now certain to be built without unnecessary delay. Sir Thomas Tanager is an authority on railroad construction, as every body knows. He built the great Fifth of North Bridge, the Delagoa Bay Railroad, the Tehuacan pcc Railroad and the White Pass Railway, and when he said he was only surprised that our route had been so long unused he expressed an enthusiasm about the enterprise that at once enlisted the co-operation of his associates.

"Our route is the most direct one to the South, and with the construction of the Nicaragua Canal will afford the most direct route to Greytown, and will inevitably become the great thoroughfare for trade with the West Indies as well as the Orient."

The Directors and others will remain here for a day or two attending to various matters in connection with the work in hand.


